What is AI?

- **Artificial Intelligence (AI)**
 - “makes it possible for machines/computers to learn from experience, adjust to new information or inputs and perform human-like tasks”

What is Generative AI?

- Generative AI
 - ‘generates’ new content based on existing knowledge-bases.
 - Learns patterns from existing data and can be ‘trained’ by humans to refine itself.

Why Now?

- Last 10 years
 - Immense volumes of data
 - Advanced algorithms
 - Improvements in computing power
 - Cheaper availability of the above

How are these tools used?

- Use cases
 - Cases in which any of these tools may be useful

Use Case 1 – Use AI tools instead of (Google) Search

- Singular answer to closed-end questions
 - “In LaTeX, how do I represent a differential equation?”
 - “Give me the tree for species, order, etc. for primates”
 - “Two trains are driving toward one another. The first train leaves Town A at 5am traveling at 60 miles per hour. The second train leaves Town B at 7am traveling at 70 miles per hour. the distance between Town A and Town B is 455 miles. What is the EXACT time that the collision will occur?”

Use Case 1 – Use AI Tools instead of (Google) Search

- Conversational discussion to a solution
 - “Explain the Socratic method to me”
 - “Was Socrates successful in using this method?”
 - “Would this method have resulted in his death?”
 - “Why did Charlotte select Brandon Miller in the NBA Draft?”
 - ”But Scoot Henderson was right there for the taking!”

Use Case 2 – Explain complex ideas in any teaching style

- **Sociology**

- “Explain why manufacturing industries are important to a national economy, if I am an average voter in South Carolina.”
- “If I am a 15-year old who is not considering college, explain why differential equations are important.”

Use Case 3 – Get ideas on (almost) any topic

- **Your job**

- “My boss just asked me for my contributions to the cause in the last 9 months. Give me a few ideas that a CIO might have contributed to a community college.”
 - “4 sounds plausible. Give me a specific project plan for idea 4”

- **Using Tome to start a presentation**

- “I will be presenting to a community college cabinet about the need to hire an IT trainer. Put together a slide deck for me, with appropriate icons and images for pushing this case. Also put in some numbers about salary”

Use Case 3 – Get ideas on (almost) any topic

- Planning your life
 - “What would be a good vacation spot for celebrating my wife’s 45th birthday?”
 - “If I want to be cheap and I live in the Southeast US, where would I take her?”
 - “I’m thinking of doing a 5K in a few months. What is a good training plan to get up to speed? Feel free to ask me questions about my current physical state.”

Use Case 3 – Get ideas on (almost) any topic

- Designing

- “Write the outline and detailed subsections for a bill for a member of Congress that would advocate changes to the federal student aid program. Make the bill palatable to both Democratic and Republican party members.”
- “Give me some interesting ideas of decorating a living room with a Southern US slant.”

Use Case 4 – Stitch together various services

- Copy and Paste previous input into DALL-E2 or MidJourney

Use Case 5 – Get a good recipe (finally!)

- “Give me a highly rated recipe for birria tacos”
 - “Can I use an Instant Pot to make this?”
- Try [MoodFood](#)

Use Case 6 – Solve homework assignments

- “What are the important events that led to Putin taking command in Russia?”

Use Case 6 – Solve homework assignments

- “An IPv4 packet has arrived with MF bit as 0, the offset value is 200, the value of HLEN is 5 and the total length field is 100. Is this the first, last or middle fragment? What is the first and last byte number of this packet?”

Use Case 7 – Summarize meeting transcripts and other long documents.

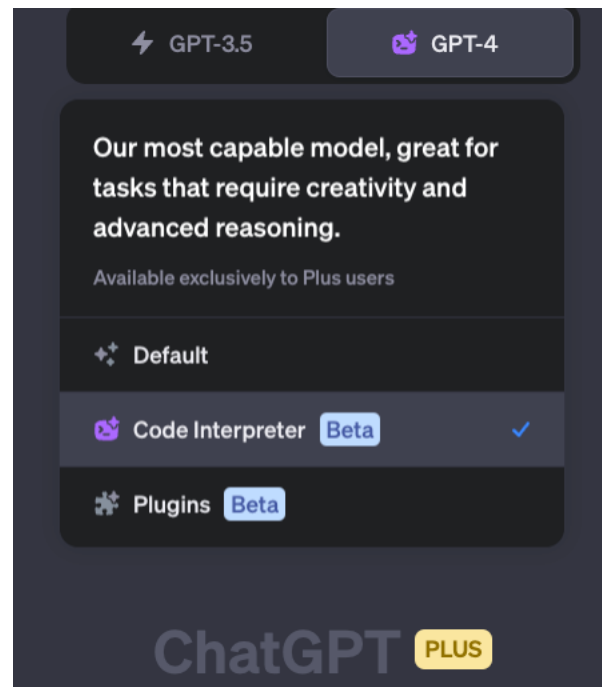
- “My community college is about to undergo reaffirmation from SACSCOC. What are my first steps?”
- “Here is the transcript for a Zoom meeting. Give me the main points and what the action items are.”
- “What are the changes in the student aid program according to this PDF?”

Use Case 8 – (for the programming geeks) Get a start on cool software

- “I have a setup of a Windows machine locally. I would like to set up a program in Python that allows me to upload an image to an Amazon Web Service that will check the image to see if there is a cat in it. Can you do that?”

Use Case 9 – Be an armchair data scientist

- ChatGPT's Code Interpreter or Claude




What shall we ask any of these tools?

- Shout out some questions.

Key Limitations of these tools

- May occasionally generate incorrect information
- May occasionally produce harmful instructions or biased content
- ChatGPT has limited knowledge of world and events after 2021
 - Bing-Chat (in beta) now overcomes this limitation
 - Bard is current
- “invents facts and makes up stories that sound truthful, but are complete nonsense”
 - [CAVEAT AI EMPTOR](#)

Other interesting details about these tools

- Most will not be free
 - “computational costs are eye-watering”
 - Paid subscription of ChatGPT Plus (\$20/month) was introduced early Feb 2023
- ChatGPT is being incorporated into Microsoft’s Bing search engine
 - Early reports suggest major issues, but great successes as well.
- Bard is free, for now
- Image/Video/Code generation tools are subscription-based, anywhere between \$5-\$50 per month.

From ChatGPT to AI

Abstract

We examined the productivity of experimental subjects using generative AI technology, the assistive chatbot ChatGPT, in writing tasks. In a preregistered controlled experiment, we exposed half of them to ChatGPT. We found that ChatGPT raised productivity: The average productivity rose by 18%. Inequality between subjects about AI temporarily rose. Workers using ChatGPT were 2 times as likely to report using it and 1.6 times as likely to use it more often.

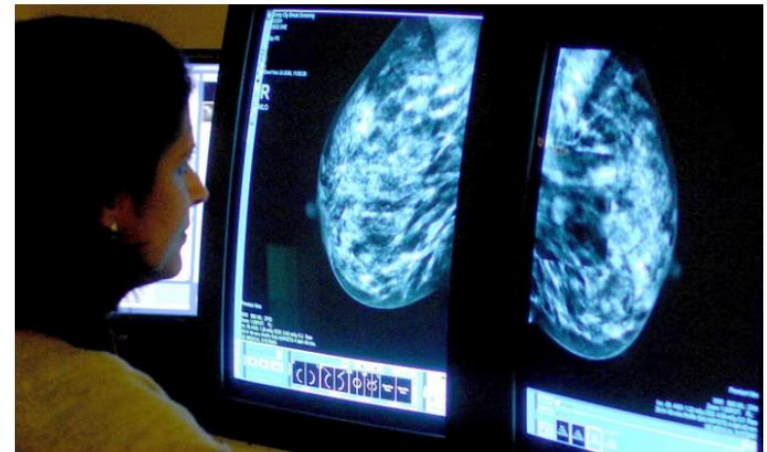

Why is it important for me to know about Generative AI?

- Highly disruptive technology
 - Wharton professor Ethan Mollick
 - Had ChatGPT create an exam question for his course including the scoring rubric.
 - He then had ChatGPT write an essay as the answer to the exam question.
 - He let ChatGPT score the essay according to that rubric.
 - He also asked ChatGPT to create a student's complaint about the grade for the essay,
 - He had ChatGPT create the professor's response to the complaint,
 - He then had ChatGPT create the student's subsequent evaluation of the professor.
 - Conclusion - "Disturbingly realistic."
 - This happened in December 2022

Why is it important for me to know about Generative AI?


Why is it important for me to know about Generative AI?

- Easily accessible and popular
 - Time it took to reach 1 million users
 - Netflix - 3.5 years
 - Facebook - 10 months
 - Spotify - 5 months
 - Instagram - 2.5 months
 - ChatGPT - 5 days (currently stands at an estimated 170 million users, paid and unpaid)
- Flip side – promises to exacerbate inequity issues
 - Gender – Men believe in and expect the AI transformation to take place at higher rates than women
 - Race – White workers believe in and expect the AI transformation to take place at higher rates than Black and Latino workers.
 - Income – Higher-paid workers believe in and expect the AI transformation to take place at higher rates than lower-paid workers
 - Education Attained – Those with a degree believe in and expect the AI transformation to take place at higher rates than those without.

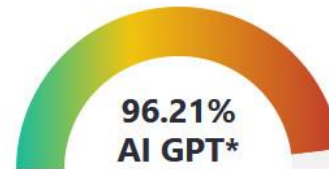

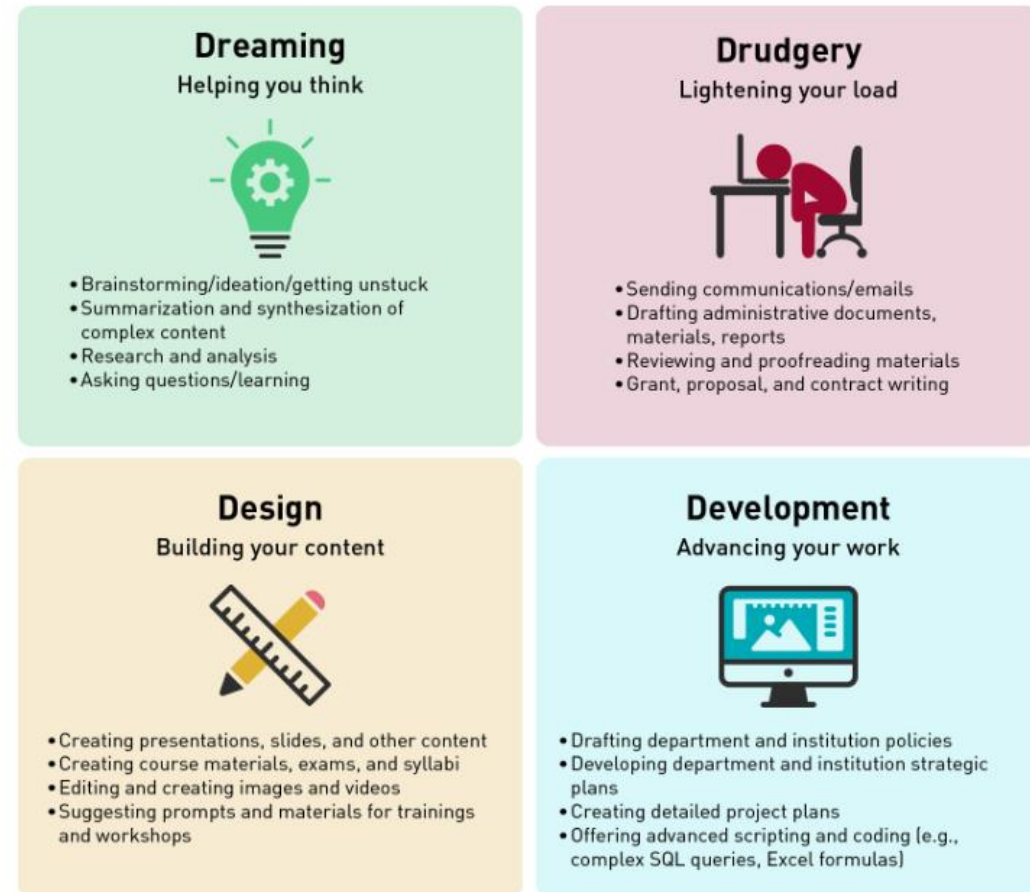
