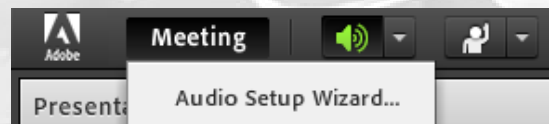

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Online Teaching is the New Default

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Statistics that should give you pause ...

- **11% of college loans are 90 days or more in default.**
- **In-state college tuition grows at twice the rate of inflation.**
- **49% of grads say their degree did not generate a higher salary.**
- **Volume of high school graduates in SC falls 3% by 2030.**
- **Online education can deliver the same learning outcomes at 30% of traditional costs.**
- **1 in 3 college students are taking an online course.**
- **1 in 6 college students complete their degree 100% online.**



As educators, are we the car or the horse and buggy?

Computer ≠ Better Typewriter
Online Instruction ≠ Better Traditional Classroom



Online learning changes the educational DNA of students ...

- **Students require a stronger sense of emotional connection to the instructor and peers to compensate for a weaker sense of human community naturally created by online interaction.**
- **Students expect to enjoy the full technological benefits of the online learning platform (online gradebook, calendar function, video feedback on assignments, etc.).**
- **Students are less tolerant of disorganization and unclear connection of content and activity to learning objectives.**
- **Students give instructors less benefit of the doubt and protest more vigorously when there is a teaching failure.**

3 Dimensions of Online Teaching Performance

ORGANIZATION

- Post dates and material many weeks in advance
- Do not cancel events or move due dates
- Answer emails within 24 hours (or sooner)
- Rotate high and low intensity during course
- Make it very clear how grades are determined

CONTENT

- Strongly integrate theory and application
- Do not surrender intellectual challenge
- Know that busy work fuels disengagement
- Avoid excessive reliance on publisher materials
- Tightly align material with student assessment

PRESENCE

- Let students get to know you personally
- Encourage students to call instead of email you
- Be empathetic but stick to the syllabus plan
- Inject enthusiasm and energy in video sessions
- Don't be "all business" in communication



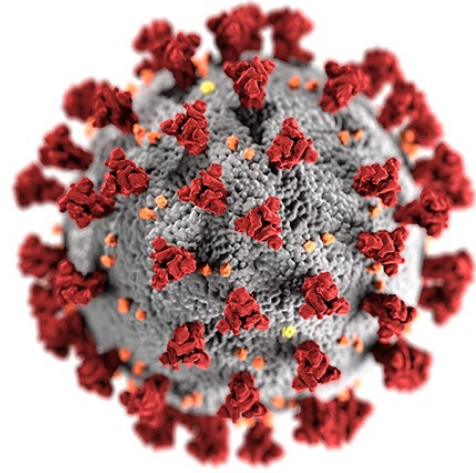
Improve learning outcomes and save yourself time with best practices ...

- **Embrace institutional standardization of online course visual design and content presentation.**
- **Segment material and assignments into two week instead of one week modules.**
- **Organize and post all material for the course (from beginning to end) at least two weeks before the term starts.**
- **Reduce time spent perfecting presentation of material to increase time available for individual feedback to students.**
- **Make video lectures asynchronous. Synchronous sessions must involve audio and video interaction with students.**



Improve learning outcomes and save yourself time with best practices ...

- **Assign roles and limit per-post word count and posting frequency in discussion boards. If possible, replace discussion boards with interactive video sessions.**
- **Increase your emphasis on emotional learning. Simulations with effective debriefing can achieve this.**
- **Visually map the learning of topics and their interconnection in the syllabus and continuously remind students where they are in the course journey.**
- **Never delay response to a student, even if the response is “I’ll get back to you later”.**



For hybrid teaching that complies with social distancing (i.e., you can only see a half or third of your class at a time), treat your course as 100% self-contained online (i.e., a student can make an A if she never sees you in person). Time with students is treated as supplemental – not core – to the course. Tutorials, review, live problem solving, and interactive discussions are optimal for in-class sessions. Don't bank on in-class taping technology.
